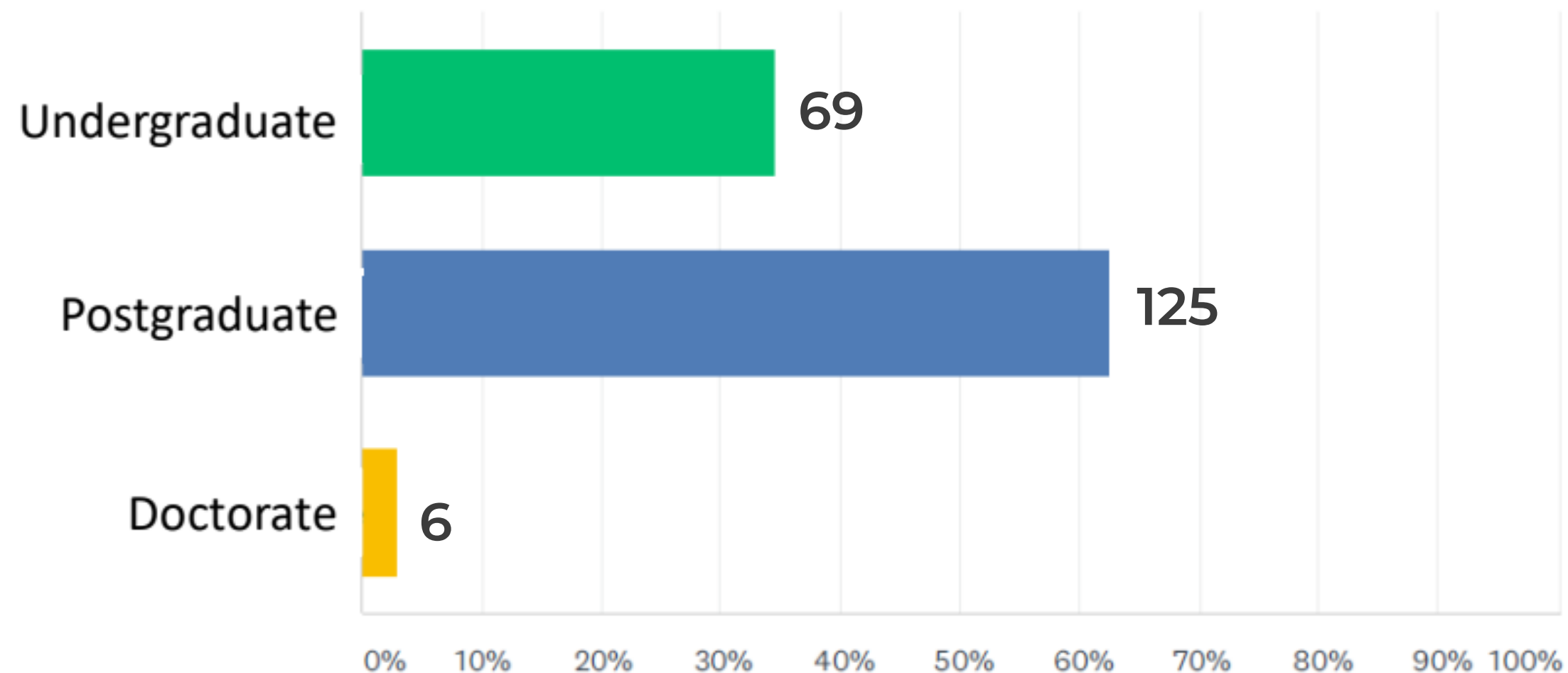

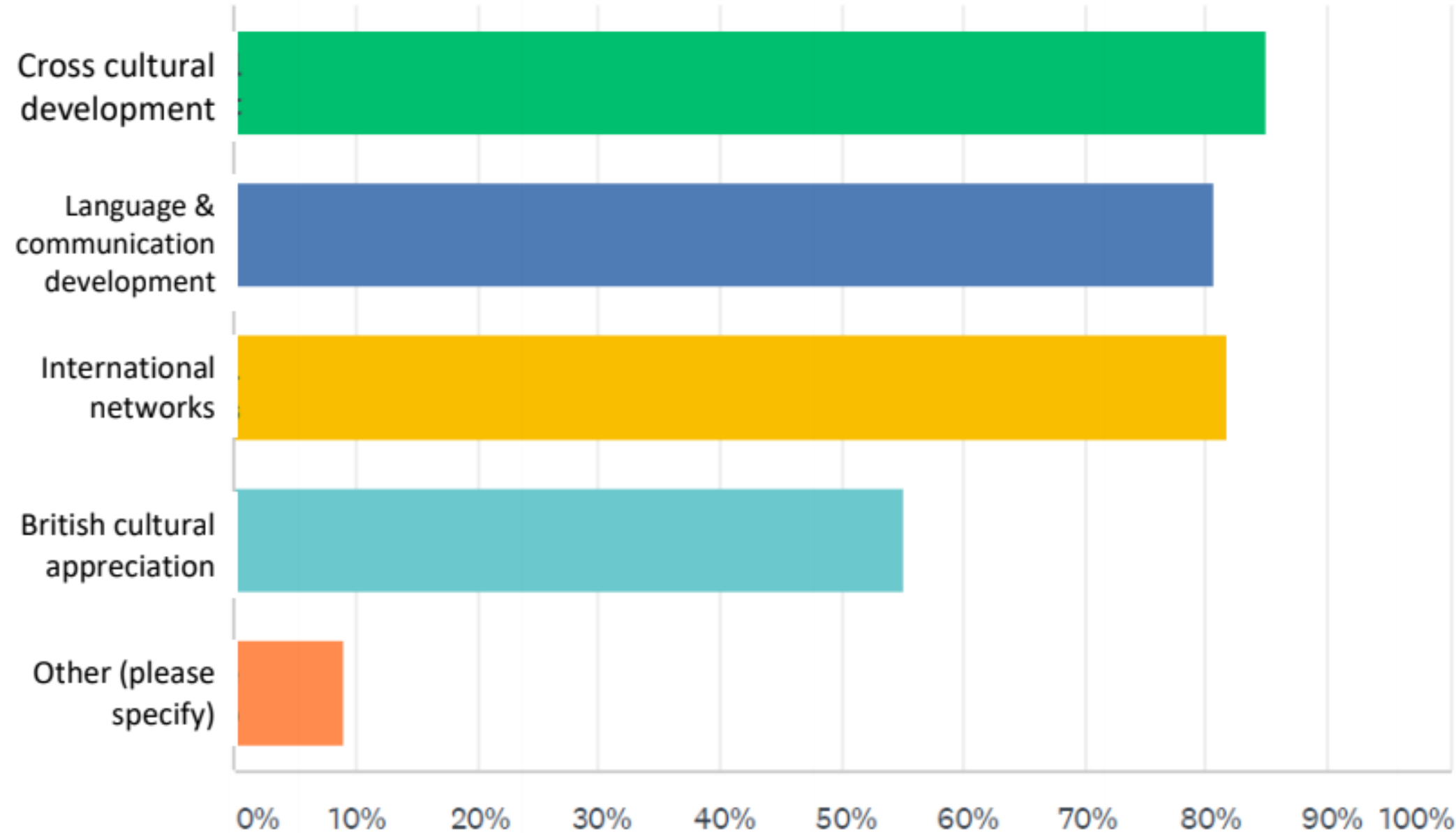
Q: What degree did you take in the UK?

62.5% of respondents took post-graduate degree, 34.5% took undergraduate degree and there are 6 respondents (3%) who took doctorate degree in the UK.





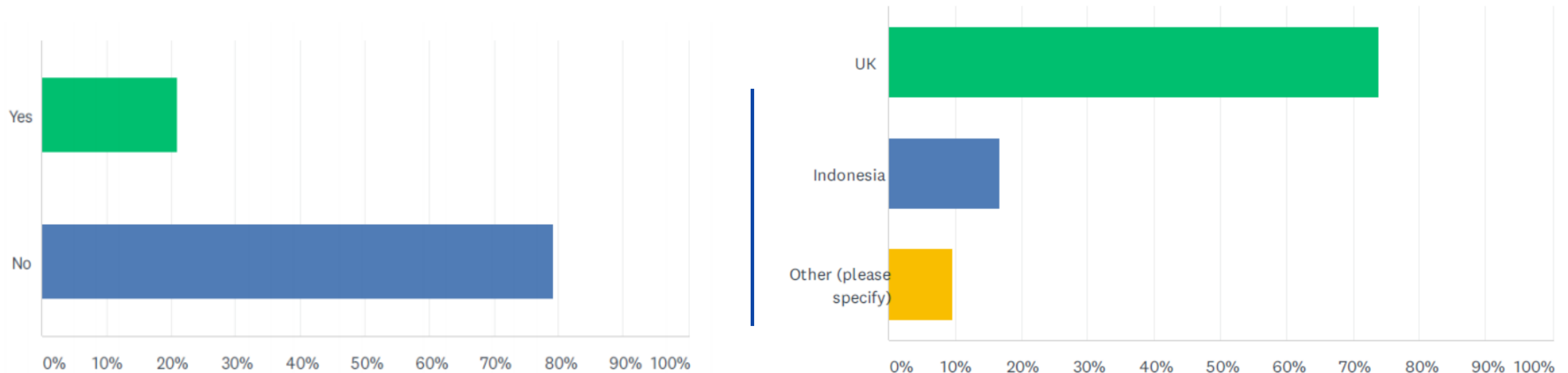
Other than academic skills, what other benefits did you get from studying in the UK?



Cross cultural development is one of non-academic skills gained by our respondents (85%) from studying in the UK, followed by international networks (81.5%) and language & communication development (80.5%).



Did you do an internship programme/placement as part of your study? If yes, where did you take it?



158 respondents (79%) did not do an internship programme in their study period.

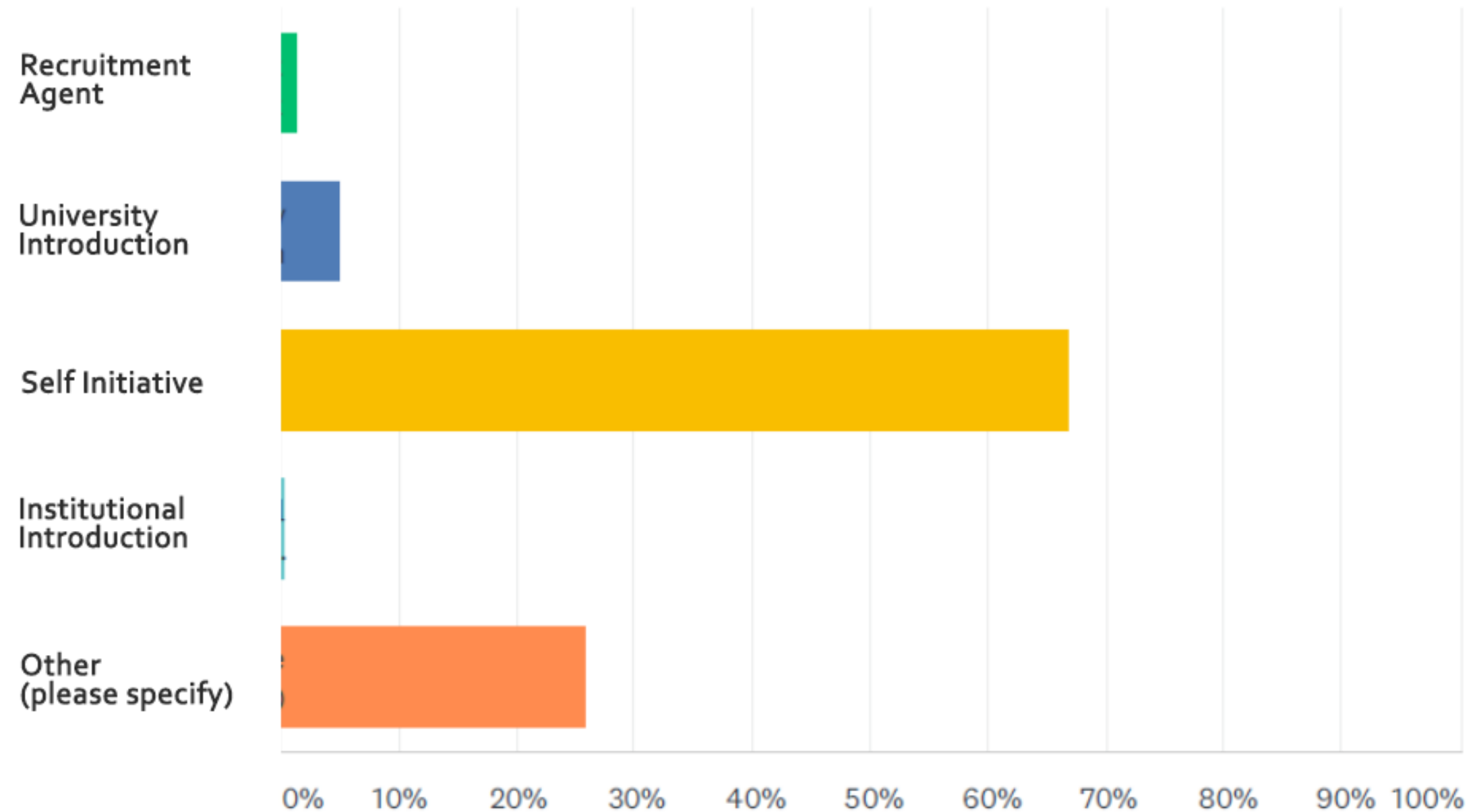
For those who did, most of them had their programme in the UK (73.8%) and 9.52% of respondents did their internship programme in other countries such as Geneva, Germany, Hong Kong and Singapore.



How did you find your first job?

Half of our respondents got their first-job in less than three months after they graduated from the UK.

134 of our respondents (67%) found their first job through their self-initiative, with only 10 respondents (5%) getting their first job from university introduction and 3 (1.5%) respondents answered recruitment agent assisted them.

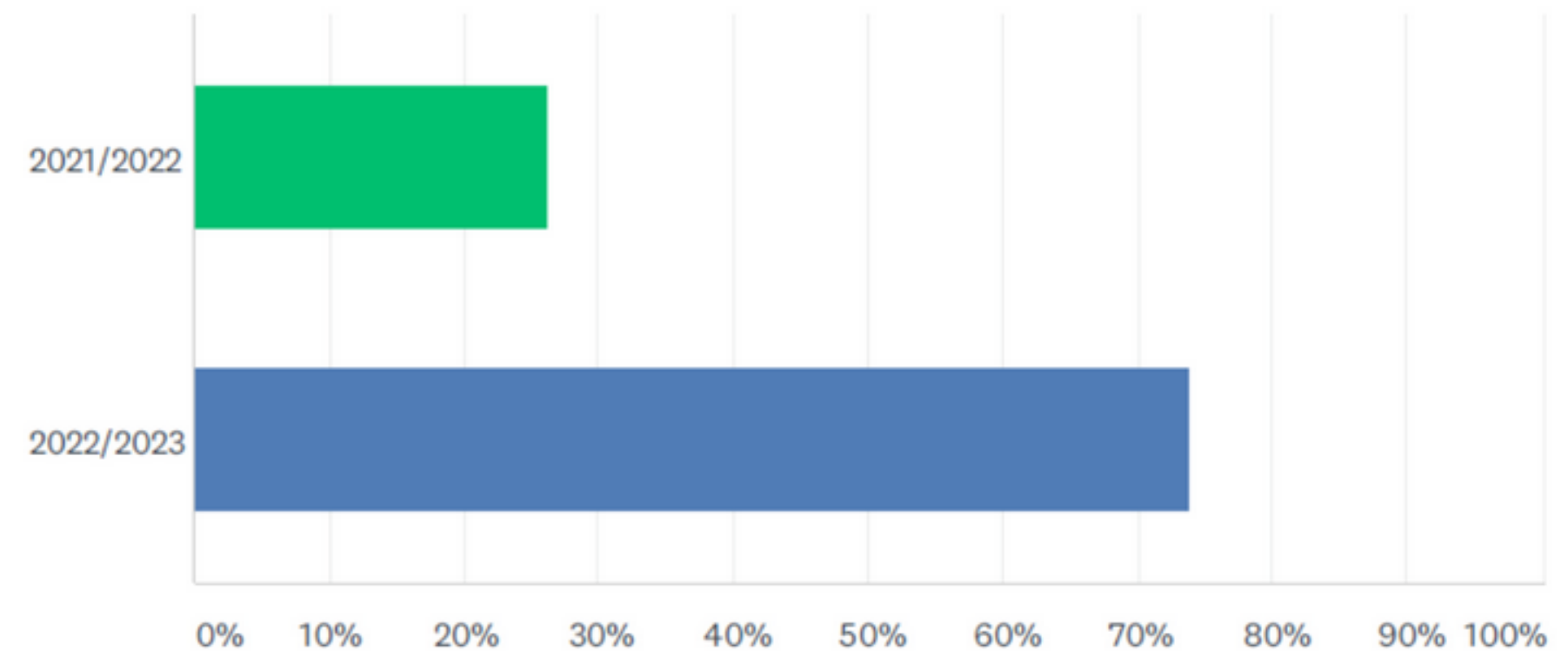
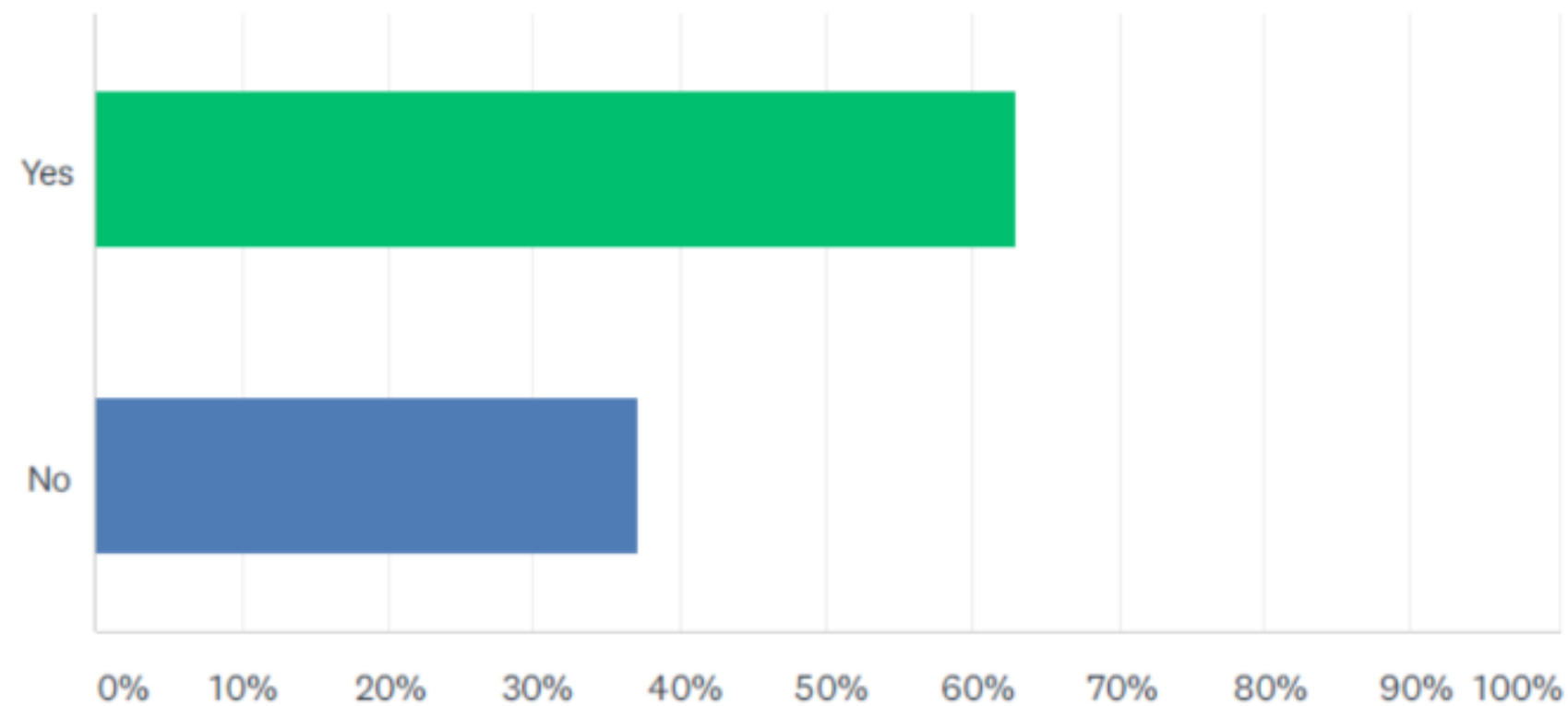




Are you considering further study? If yes, when are you likely to do a further study?

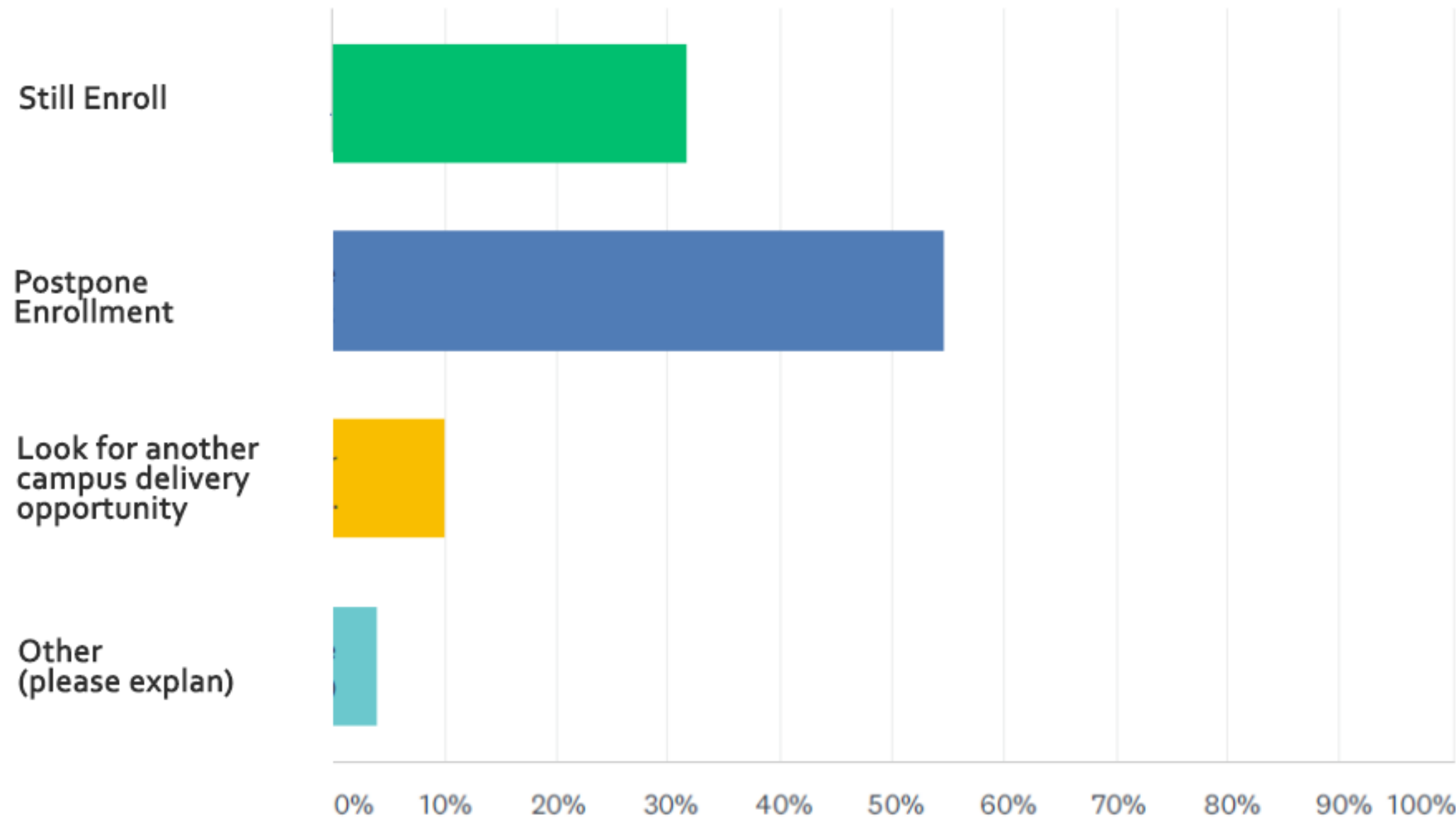
Out of 200 respondents, 126 respondents are considering doing further study where 93 of them would like to continue their study in the year 2022/2023.

Interestingly, 116 respondents answered that they have siblings that are considering foreign education option.
